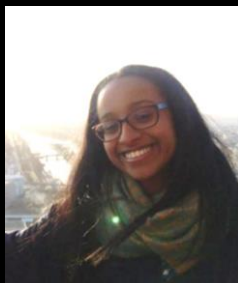

Rita Dove is an internationally acclaimed African-American poet and author, whose work is known for its lyricism, beauty and sense of history. Her latest book, *Collected Poems 1974-2004*, was released in May 2016, and was selected as a finalist for the National Book Award, and winner of the NAACP Image Award in Poetry. THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY
WEEK OF APRIL 3RD – 9TH



April 4 – On this date, Nobel Peace Prize laureate Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was assassinated at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, TN, at the age of 39. A Baptist minister and founder of the Southern Christian Leadership

Conference (SCLC), King led the US Civil Rights Movement from the mid-1950s until his death, using a combination of powerful words and non-violent tactics. Sit-ins, boycotts and protest marches (including the massive March on Washington in 1963) were some of the tools used to fight segregation and achieve significant civil and voting rights advances for African-Americans. On April 4, 1968, King was rushed to St. Joseph's Hospital, where he was pronounced dead. James Earl Ray, a fugitive from the Missouri State Penitentiary, was arrested on June 8, 1968, in London at Heathrow Airport, extradited to the United States, and charged with the crime. On March 10, 1969, Ray entered a plea of guilty and was sentenced to 99 years in the Tennessee State Penitentiary. Ray later made many attempts to withdraw his guilty plea and be tried by a jury, but was unsuccessful; he died in prison.

Booker T. Washington was born on April 5, 1856 in Hale's Ford, Virginia. He was an African-American educator, author, orator, and advisor to Presidents of the United States. Between 1890 and 1915, Washington was a dominant leader in the African-American



community, as one of the last generation of Black leaders born into slavery. He became a key voice of former slaves and their descendants, who were oppressed by disfranchisement and the Jim Crow discriminatory laws enacted in the post-Reconstruction era. Tuskegee Institute (now University), a historically black college in Alabama, was his base of operations where he raised money, strategized, and networked to execute plans for uplifting African-Americans. Other notable leaders of the times, such as WEB DuBois and Marcus Garvey, disagreed with many of Washington's tactics, which led to debates within Black communities as to how to achieve racial, political and social equality.
