Barbara Jordan

Barbara Charline Jordan (February 21, 1936 – January 17, 1996) was a lawyer, educator, an American politician, and a leader of the Civil Rights

Movement. This Texas native was the first African-American elected to the Texas Senate after Reconstruction, and the first Southern African-American woman elected to the United States House of Representatives. She received numerous honors in her lifetime, including the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

UNCF: A Mind Is A Terrible Thing To Waste

In 1943, Dr. Frederick D. Patterson, president of Tuskegee Institute (now Tuskegee University), wrote an open letter in the *Pittsburgh Courier* to the presidents of the nation's private black colleges, urging them to "pool their small monies and make a united appeal to the national conscience." His words would soon become the guiding principle for one of the world's leading education assistance organizations. One year later, the United Negro College Fund (UNCF) was incorporated on April 25, 1944 with 27 member colleges and a combined enrollment of 14,000 students. **For more information visit:** <https://www.uncf.org/pages/Frederick-Douglass-Patterson>
