Nikki Giovanni is an African-American poet, author, speaker and social activist, who first reached prominence during the late 1960s and early 1970s for

her lyrical style and fresh approach to the literary arts. She was born in Knoxville, Tennessee, on June 7, 1943, and grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio. Giovanni graduated with honors in history from her grandfather's alma mater, Fisk University. THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY WEEK OF MARCH 27TH – APRIL 2ND



Born on March 27, 1924, in Newark, New Jersey, Sarah Vaughan grew up with a love of music and performing. Winning a talent competition held at Harlem's Apollo Theater launched her singing career. She worked with bandleaders Earl Hines and Billy Eckstine, before becoming a successful solo performer who commingled pop and jazz. Nicknamed "Sassy" and "The Divine One", Vaughan was a four-time Grammy Award winner, including receiving a Lifetime Achievement Award. The National Endowment for the Arts bestowed upon her its highest honor in jazz, the NEA Jazz Masters Award, in 1989. Pearl Mae Bailey (March 29, 1918 – August 17, 1990) was born in Newport News, Virginia, and rose to fame as an American actress and singer. After appearing in vaudeville, she made her Broadway debut in *St. Louis Woman* in 1946. She won a Tony Award for the title role in the all-black production of *Hello, Dolly!* in 1968. In 1986, she won a Daytime Emmy award for her performance as a fairy godmother in the ABC Afterschool Special, *Cindy Eller: A Modern Fairy Tale*. She received the Screen Actors Guild Life Achievement Award in 1976 and the Presidential Medal of Freedom on October 17, 1988. **For more**

On this day in 1870, Secretary of State Hamilton Fish certified that the requisite three-fourths of the states had ratified the 15th Amendment, thereby ensuring in the U.S. Constitution the right of African-American men to vote. The amendment, which Congress had approved in 1869, reads: "The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of race, color, or previous condition of servitude."
